

As tick populations increase in Oakville, the options for tick control are growing too! Back this year is the popular ADVANTAGE MULTI and K9 ADVANTIX combo pack for coverage of heartworm, intestinal parasites, fleas, ticks, and more! NEW this year for those that prefer REVOUTION is a combo pack containing a new ORAL tick prevention chew, SIMPARICA.

TICK CONTROL MEDICATION

There are currently no products available that effectively control and prevent heartworm AND ticks in a single medication, therefore a combination of 2 medications are needed for complete parasite control for dogs!

Spring Cleaning

Spring can be a messy time of year for dog owners. Melting snow, rain, and mud makes for wet and dirty paws! Check out these products that help keep your dog, your house, and your car messfree.

Microfiber Doormat (eg. Soggy Doggy®): Train your pet to lay on this mat after returning

from a walk in wet weather. The highly absorbent material will dry up drippy paws and reduce the amount of mud tracked into the house. Alternatively, look for microfiber mitts or gloves (such as Spotless Paw ®), to give your pet's paws a quick drying rub-down before entering the house or car!

Car Seat Hammock: Keep your back seat clean and dry with a waterproof hammock. These easy-to-install seat protectors prevent mud and moisture from soaking into your car seats. They can be easily removed and cleaned.

Pet Wipes: For smaller dog and cat paws, you may find it easier to clean the paws with disposable pet wipes. If you can't find a pet wipe, baby wipes work too!




As we transition into nicer weather, outdoor activities with pets are on the rise. Is your furry friend prepared? Here are some important considerations for spring safety:



Ensure your pets nails are trimmed short. Reduced activity in the winter can allow nails to overgrow because there is reduced natural wearing of the nails. Longer nails can break when dogs are more active outdoors.

Ease in to physical activity. You may have maintained your cardiovascular fitness through the winter, but if your pet has been a couch potato, they will need some time to adjust to increased physical activity.



Watch out for debris outside that may tempt your pet to 'indulge'. Melted 'poopsicles', garbage, water from puddles, and other materials can cause upset stomach and diarrhea, and may put your pet at risk for parasitic, viral, and bacterial infection. Ensure your pet's vaccines are up to date!

Lily flowers (particularly Easter Lilies) are toxic to cats. They can cause kidney failure if a curious cat chews on parts of the plant. Cat owners would be wise to avoid these flowers in the house!
